1859, 160 years ago, was an eventful year.



Oregon became the 33rd state of the union.

Daniel Sickles, a US congressman from New York, shot and killed Barton Key, the US District Judge for Washington DC, in LaFayette Park, across the street from the White House. Congressman Sickles becomes the first person to get away with murder with a plea of temporary insanity.

The first zoo in the country opened in Philadelphia.

Astronomer Edmond Modeste Lescarbault claimed he found a planet closer to the Sun than Mercury, he names the planet Vulcan. His discovery does not "live long or prosper," as no one else ever sees the place.

The last war between the United States and Britain is fought over a border dispute in Washington. The only casualty is a pig. It goes into history as the Pig War.

Big Ben chimes for the first time in London.

Charles Darwin published *The Origin of the Species*. Karl Marx published *A Critic of the Political Economy*.

A radical emancipationist, John Brown, is hung in Virginia after his unsuccessful raid on Harpers Ferry Arsenal. The American Civil War starts two years later.

At the end of the service there will be a pot luck meal in the Fellowship Hall. At 1:30 we will return to the auditorium for a Gospel concert featuring *Grand Prairie*. We also plan to take a group photo of everyone, and a group photo of all those who have been members of the church for 50 years or longer. Join us for the celebration. So much has changed over the last 160 years, but the gospel and mission of the church has not. We preach and celebrate Christ and salvation through faith and trust in Him.
