#### From the Pastor's Desk

"What should I call you?" That's what a salesman for a Church DVD Bible Study series asked me a few days ago when I answered the phone. That is a question people sometimes ask. I have never really cared much, and sometimes I say, "My mother named me Terry. So I have always answered to that." My children have said they have to say "Bro Terry" if they want me to listen to them, and that "Dad" doesn't work on me. A few people have said that they feel uncomfortable calling me by my first name because they don't think that is showing the proper respect.

I know that when you address a king, or a queen, or someone who has been elected or appointed to a high office, there is a proper way of addressing them: "Mr. President," "Your Highness," "Your Excellency," "Your Honor." I do believe that a title, or a proper address, is demanded to show respect for the position, but not the person.

Within the church there is a wide-range of titles that have been affixed to my name: "Brother," "Bro. Terry," "Brother Pastor," "Pastor Terry." Back in the day the name "Elder" was used for the office, according to the old church minutes. Then there was "Reverend," "Right Reverend," and "Very Right Reverend." Catholics have always used "Father." The Lutherans and Presbyterians use the word "Reverend." Baptists today just say "Pastor" or "Brother." My least favorite of all is "Preacher," but I will answer to that when it's used. My favorite memory is of little Madison calling me "Uncle Terry." That one made me smile.

Back to the question, "What do I call you?" Well, I think "Pastor Terry" is still quite appropriate for children, just like they call the elementary teacher "Mr. or Miss (name)." However, as they grow up and move into high school, college, and adult life, then, as Paul Simon said in a song, "When you call me, you can call me, (Terry)." I am still the pastor of the church; I still sign church letters, and certificates. I will still be introduced, at various times and places, as "Terry Fortner, the pastor of Zion Hill." But, realize please, no matter how you address me, I am Terry. I am just a member of the team. Saved, called, and given grace by God, just like everyone else.

You can call me "Terry," unless you're a salesman. Then you should call me "The Very Right Reverend Uninterested!!" God bless, and I love you all.
