From the Pastor's Desk

There is a word that we use today that means so much more than we realize. It's the word "gospel." The word



actually means, "good news." The angels first announced it over a stable in Bethlehem, the apostles died for it, and today it is proclaimed across the planet in churches, missions, and Bible studies from the cold of the north and south poles, to the tropics around the equator.

The "gospel" is about the good news that God can change us. I really believe that most of us would like to change. It really doesn't matter what we would like to change about ourselves. Some would like to change their appearance, lose weight, look younger, or try a different hair color. The cosmetics and diet industries are banking on that.

There are more important changes that we would like to make. We desire to be less judgmental, less negative, stop doing the wrong things, "sin." We want to be more righteous, try to stop gossiping, getting angry, always be truthful. We want to begin anew, but usually find that in a few days, sometimes in only hours, our efforts have failed. Our old ways come rushing back. We fail because we are relying on only ourselves, and our self-reliant strategy is always destined to failure. Our many failures leave us feeling defeated.

But the gospel is good news. Jesus offers a different way for us to change. The only way! It is not by gritting our teeth, digging in, and pulling ourselves up by our own bootstraps. The change that is good news is change done by trusting in Christ. It is the work of God's Holy Spirit. Jesus spoke of this change in John 15, "Apart from me you can do nothing." Real change, lasting change, comes from God's working in us. Our only real hope for change is by offering ourselves up to God, as we are, so He can make us who He wants us to be. "I appeal to you, therefore, brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God---what is good and acceptable and perfect." (Romans 12:1-2) The transforming work of God is always done by our cooperation and willingness to let Him change what we cannot change. Our part is to seek His power and His presence each day, and take advantage of our times of worship, prayer, and studying His Word.

So, good news! God can change you! It starts with His forgiveness of your sin as you turn from your ways and trust in God's way. Then it continues as He works by the Holy Spirit to change you and make you a new creation in Christ Jesus. The Gospel is Good News!!!!

Inspire Women's Conference



I want to take this time to share something with you all that God has had on my heart. Often times I feel as though I am spinning in circles and not reaching many people for Christ. In church we have created so much busy work; busy work that seems to be more about personal preference and comforts for us as members. It is so easy to fall into the trap of being an inward-focused church as opposed to the outward-focused church that God has called us to be. Too often we come together to express our faith in God while also looking to see what benefits are in it for us. When doing this we become so off track that we miss the point totally.

In James 2:14-17 it says, "What good is it, my brothers, if a man claims to have faith but has no deeds? Can such faith save him? Suppose a brother or sister is without clothes and daily food. If one of you says to him, 'Go, I wish you well; keep warm and well fed,' but does nothing about his physical needs, what good is it? In the same way, faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead."

For me, this hits home! As I type this I am wondering what needs are in my own community that I don't even see and help with because I am so focused on me and the comfort of we that already claim Christ. In Matthew 28 we have what we call the "Great Commission" where we are told to "go and make disciples." When we "go," with what purpose do we go? My conviction is that personally I find myself going and expecting Jesus to be pleased with me if I represent Him well to those like me, but not going with a purpose. The point of the passage is not to just go, but to make disciples as we go, and I am totally convinced we must do something specific as we go for this to happen. We must go with a goal of meeting the needs of those around us who need Jesus. We must go with an openness to get out of our comfort zones and into the trenches where the people needing help are found. These people may not be anything like us as far as we can tell, but we only need to have one thing in common for us to see and meet their needs. That is the fact that we are all sinners who need to be saved by grace. Let us all be in prayer about how God wants to use us as individuals, and as a church, to reach people in our community who are in need.
