Pain is inevitable. It can range from short term inconvenience to long term intensity. It can be like a ham-



mer on a thumb and pass in a day or two, or it can sting and ache for the rest of your life, and be terminal. You cannot, however, avoid pain in this life. Job is an example of a good and godly man who suffered devastating loss. Yet, even in the midst of his darkest days, he continued to trust in God. Starting on October 27, I will be leading a study of the book of Job on Sunday nights at 5:30 in the Sanctuary. The goal will be to learn from Job how to keep trusting the sovereignty of God, and that your Redeemer is for you no matter what pain you are experiencing.

Philippians 4:19 says, "My God will liberally supply (fill until full) your every need according to His riches in glory in Christ Jesus." We never need to live in fear of our painful situations, because above all pain is our relationship with God. We always have an inexhaustible supply of grace. Job is an example of one who endured painful loss, physical suffering, and the accusing words of friends who should have offered comfort. However, in the end he chose the path of faith in God. His victory was because he declared in the midst of the worst time in his life, "I know my redeemer lives."

We are excited about our next studies in our Growth Groups starting on October 27. Our fellowship meal will be at 5:00pm and our classes will begin at 5:30pm. There are various subjects/classes for you to consider as we move forward. Sign-ups for the studies (Oct 27 – Dec 22) are available now in the Breezeway. Here is a little information about the choices you have:

Baptist Adults – This is the primary Southern Baptist literature for discipleship. This literature will be an option every time we sign up for new studies as its subject matter is constantly changing. For this study session the subjects covered will be: "What The Bible Says About Angels," and "What Is The World Coming To."

Defined – At this very moment, what you believe about your own purpose and value affects almost every area of your life – including how you think and feel, the way you react to circumstances, and how you approach God and your relationships. But what is guiding your core beliefs? Are they healthy and founded upon solid truth? Or are they constantly shifting with the opinions of others or your own emotions? *Defined* challenges you to let the One who knows you best be the One who guides your heart the most.

Making Space – Do you know what's most important in life? Do you feel too busy to make time for those things? This study gleans wisdom from the Book of Proverbs and from the example of Jesus to show you how to center your life on God's priorities. You will examine the things that matter most to God and to you as a follower of Christ. Then you will learn to apply Godly wisdom that will help you incorporate these activities into your busy life.

Job – Joy is the constant companion of those who trust in the Lord. And, while you can find it in friends, family, and circumstances, unfailing, persistent joy will only ever overflow from your relationship with Jesus. In this study you will discover the redemptive side to Job's story of suffering. Learn to use pain to strengthen your faith, point others to the gospel, and remember God's providence will never take you to a place where His grace will not sustain you.
