March 18, 2020 9:39 AM. My heart is grieving, and I have been praying, because of uncertainty. Are we having church? First of all, we cannot cancel church, and church is not something we have; church is something we are. But I know the question is really “are we gathering together with others to worship?” Because I appreciate corporate worship so much, I hate to cancel a worship service. My heart is heavy because I can see where the COVID-19 epidemic might take us, and it will be a decision I don’t like, and a way I don’t want to go. I have been a pastor for forty years, and I have never wanted to cancel a worship service for snow, but I have done so when the highway department has issued a winter weather warning, like this: “Heavy snow expected. Travel will be very difficult to impossible. Total snow accumulations of 6 to 12 inches are expected. Visibility will be a half mile or less at times.”

Now, because of a virus, I have to pray and think about canceling a worship service. COVID-19 has caused this warning from the Presidential Task Force, the Center for Disease Control, the Governor’s Office, and the Pulaski County Health Department: To stop the spread of Coronavirus “avoid groups of 10+. Organizations, including Faith Based Organizations, should cancel large meetings.” The definition of a large meeting started at 500 but in a week dropped to 10+. I have met with the church council and continue to meet and discuss the question, “Are we having church?” Today the answer is yes, we are, but that might change at any time. Our back-up will be to gather on social media, at Zion Hill Group on Facebook. The video of service can then be shared. Also, look for the service on the website <https://www.zionhillcabot.com/> under resources. Or call the church office for a CD copy of the audio.

My heart is heavy because of the retiree who shared her concern as she depended on investment income each month. My heart is heavy because of the mother with four children who has to work, but now school is closed, and she doesn’t make enough to pay for child care. My heart is heavy because of the young father who was told he will be laid off next month. I am praying for all affected by this pandemic.

Yet, my heart also rejoices because God is in control, He reigns on Heaven’s throne. He knows our sufferings, and He is ready to meet our needs. Admit you are a sinner, believe that Jesus died and arose so you can be forgiven, and confess that He is your Savior and Lord. We have a chance to understand that we are the Church. Each of us are members of Christ’s body, the Church. We are His hands, His feet, His heart as we love each other and reach the lost of the world. This crisis will pass, because when Christ builds His Church, the gates of hell, (or Coronavirus COVID-19), will not prevail against it.— Matthew 16:18
