New Year 2021

We have all just gone through a year like no other for the world, the nation, and Zion Hill Baptist Church. Things started out normally in 2020, and then in March COVID-19 invaded our lives. In an effort to ensure the safety and health of those who attend the church a decision was made to cease meeting until the crisis had passed. The services were online and on Facebook. Then the crisis continued and the Resurrection Celebration became a Drive by. Next Graduation Ceremonies didn't happen. Then Mother's Day, Father's Day, the Church Picnic, were cancelled. VBS was changed, Fall Festival, and now Christmas. Social Distancing and no hugging, no handshakes. Those were replaced with hand sanitizers and mask. Herd immunity, COVID screening, and flattening the curve became part of our vocabulary and our lives. Funerals became private family-only graveside services, or delayed, as the way we respond to grief and loss of our loved ones was changed. Hospital visits and surgery waiting room ministry became a phone call only. Pot lucks and Fellowships couldn't happen. Meetings happened only by way of text messages. Then when we tried to have a return to Bible Study and in person Worship our number of people in the building was only about half what it had been before COVID-19. There was no mission trip, no summer camps, choir practices were not possible, there are no hymnals, and no offering plates being passed, no Lord's Supper trays, traditions, and the way we do things were changed. Do you know how much Baptists love changes?

Also, in March, Bro. Matt Hill, who we all loved, resigned after 9 years with us to pursue God's calling in his life elsewhere. The Personnel Committee went to work and in God's will and in answer to our prayers Richard Barkhimer joined us in October, as CYE – Children, Youth, and Education – Director. I am looking forward to the ministry God has in His will for Richard once the COVID-19 crisis is over.

It is almost overwhelming when you think about how things have changed since January 1, 2020. In spite of all that has changed this past year, I rejoice because the truth of the gospel has not changed. God loves sinners, like me and you. He sent His only Son to take our place and die on a cross to pay our debt. Jesus arose from the grave, and one day, maybe very soon, He will come again.

As we face an uncertain future after a very difficult year, we will continue to trust in Jesus Christ who is the same yesterday, today, and forever. We will continue to worship God, in whom there is no variableness, no shadow of turning. Let us continue to be faithful to the Rock of our salvation and the foundation that has been laid for us in Christ as we start a new calendar. Thank the Lord for 2021.
