One of the best-known stories in the Bible is Jesus raising Lazarus from the dead. I have read and preached about that miracle from the eleventh chapter of John many times. Last week I read it again and a new truth jumped out at me from the scripture. It is about how Jesus loved that family.

The family was Mary, Martha, and their brother, Lazarus. A message came to Jesus. He is told, "Lord, the one you love is sick." Then we are told, "Jesus loved Martha, and her sister, and Lazarus." When Jesus was at the place where Lazarus had been entombed, He wept. The crowd of people watching him said, "See how He loved him." It is clear that Jesus loved this family.

So, what do you do when you love people? Well, if you're like Jesus you eat with them, you hang out at their house every chance you get. What do you do when you're together? This year I have spent a lot of time with my own family. That has been one of the blessings of COVID-19. We have eaten together, I have worked puzzles, played board games, watched TV, and chased grandkids around the house. We have talked a lot and laughed.

Everyone's house is a little different. At my house, we scatter out when we are all together, some eat at the kitchen table, others in the dining room, and some on the couch. When the meal is over, I try to remember to take my plate to the sink, then get out of the way. The children run around inside yelling, screaming, fighting over toys. If the weather is nice, they are eventually told to go outside. If they are inside, they are told to hold it down. The grownups end up in the living room, the television might be on but nobody is watching it. We talk, and remember things, catch up on what each one is doing, and enjoy spending time with each other. Eventually someone stands up, and far too soon it's time to go, because of work, and school tomorrow. That is what you do when you love people.

In scripture, Jesus did the same with the family of Lazarus. On one occasion as He was visiting Martha tried to involve Him in her squabble with her sister Mary, who wasn't helping in the kitchen with the meal. Their house seems to have been the home base for Jesus and his disciples during His last week before His crucifixion.

They lived in Bethany, which is a small village about two miles from Jerusalem, on the opposite side of the Mount of Olives. It was at Bethany in the home of Simon the leper that Mary anointed Jesus' feet. It was at Bethany where Jesus began his entry to Jerusalem on Palm Sunday. More importantly it was in Bethany, near the home of His friend Lazarus, where Jesus ascended back into heaven. It is to the Mount of Olives near Bethany that Zechariah 14 and Revelation 19 prophesy Jesus will one day return as King of Kings and Lord of Lords.

I hope and pray that we, the people of God at Zion Hill Baptist, and as those whom the Lord loves, will share His love during the month of March. While the current pandemic is keeping us apart, let's stay together. Use your phone to call those in the church family, send encouragement online, or mail a card. When you feel safe, come join us in person as we worship together. Until that day keep in touch and watch online. When you love as Jesus loves, you will find a way spend time together.
