From the Pastor's Desk

Mother's Day has a strange history. It was celebrated at several different times, and for different reasons, before President Woodrow Wilson established the second Sunday of May as Mother's Day in 1914. One of the early reasons for the holiday before the Civil War was a Mother's Prayer for Peace Day. After the war, it was Mother's Friendship Day, so that mothers' from the north and the south could pray as a unifying force for reconciliation in all regions of the country.

The Mother's Day we have today started in 1908 in the State of West Virginia. That is when Anna Jarvis, daughter of Ann Jarvis, got the idea after the death of her mother. She wanted to persuade her church, the Gafton West Virginia Methodist Church, to hold a service honoring the sacrifices of all mothers. Thousands attended that service. That same day a retail store in Philadelphia whose owner John Wanamaker had heard of the church event held a Mother's Day sale in his store. By 1912, communities and churches across America were holding Mother's Day celebrations. Finally, in 1914 President Wilson made it official and added Mother's Day to the National Calendar.

As for Ann Jarvis, who never married or had children of her own, she regretted what had happened to her original goal for Mother's Day. What she had envisioned as a day to attend church services and give thanks to God for the sacrifices and faith of Godly mothers, had become corrupted. Hijacked as she said, by merchants, florists, and card companies to sale their products. She denounced the transformation and urged people to boycott commercial retailers, and stop buying the products they sold for Mother's Day. She spent her personal wealth to distribute booklets, conducted letter writing campaigns, and filed lawsuits to stop what she had started. When she died in 1948 Ann Jarvis was so bitter about the holiday that she disowned the whole idea, and said it had become a modern form of idolatry.

Her original idea was however, very noble, "Wear a white carnation as a badge, visit your mother, and attend church as you give thanksgiving to God for the sacrifices that Mothers have done for us all. Thank God and honor your Mother."

Join us at Zion Hill on May 9, at 11:00 and get back to the original reason for Mother's Day.
