From the Pastor's Desk



I grew up hearing prayers for peace. In public worship services, in prayer meetings, and at our family prayer time. The request for God to send peace to our world was often one of the first requests made in prayer. It was the "Cold War." The Vietnam War was going on. There was the constant saber rattling between the United States and the Soviet Union. There was the Cuban missile crisis, there was "duck and cover" bomb rehearsals in my elementary school. There were missiles buried in the ground a few miles away in White Sands Missile Range. In addition, there was civil unrest at home, and civil rights protests and riots in many American cities. Anti-War protests would turn violent at Texas Tech University which was just a short walk from the house I grew up in.

Those days of fear, war, violence, and death were very real. The hope of many during that time was for God to give us peace. I didn't understand it all back then, but I certainly do now. Very little has changed.

While we are not as of today fighting an international war, our soldiers are still engaged in military operations which could flash any day into a violent conflict. Even though our media seldom reports on these minor skirmishes, soldiers are being injured and losing their lives every day. Foreign terrorists are here in America, last Saturday a Synagogue in Texas was attacked, and four men were taken hostage.

The need today is for peace.

In the United States gun violence is higher than any other "civilized" nation in the world. I pray everyday that my grandchildren will be safe at their school, and that peaceful classrooms will make it possible for them to learn, be educated, and inspired. I pray for the teachers, and administrators of those schools to be safe, and to be able to do their jobs better in a peaceful and calm place. Yes, God and prayer for His gift of peace, belong in our schools.

In our nation the politicians have brought us to anarchy, and democracy is dying violently as rioting has replaced debate as a way of expressing different political views. Even the police who defend the public are being attacked for just doing the job we pay them to do. "No Justice, No Peace." Has become the chant of those who feel unheard and oppressed in this country. Can Jesus help us? Yes!

I believe that the prince of darkness has been allowed to control us long enough, it is time for us to beseech the Prince of Peace, to heal our nation. In John 14:27 Jesus said to his disciples, "I am leaving you with a gift, peace of mind and heart. And the peace I give is a gift the world cannot give. So do not be troubled or afraid." We need that desperately today. His salvation can and will bring peace!! Join us as we pray for peace. "No prayer, No peace."


