From the Pastor's Desk

President Adam Greenway during a convocation service at Southwestern Seminary said, "My prayer for our seminary is that we would be the kind of institution that the Lord uses to train God-called men and women who will leave here and go out and neither become a casualty yourself, nor create casualties in your wake." What he said is important.

He brought up two issues that affect the church today. There are many ministers who became casualties, after all it is a responsibility that is beyond human ability that ministers are called into by God. Jesus said, "All power is given unto me in heaven and in earth, go therefore and teach all nations baptizing them in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, teaching them to obey all things whatsoever I have commanded you, and, lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world." So, it is important that each of us minister in Jesus' power. Otherwise, we will not last.

The statistics are troubling. 80% will not be in church ministry ten years after seminary graduation. Only a small fraction will make it a lifelong career. The average seminary trained pastor will only be in the ministry for 5 years. 78% have been forced to resign from a church (68% twice) usually because of church conflict. 91% have experienced some form of burnout in ministry and 18% reported they are currently burnt out. That means they are overwhelmed by stress. (Fuller Institute of Church Study) If the shepherds of God's flock are overwhelmed, how are the sheep?

The other issue is just as disturbing. It refers to ministers who use people to satisfy their own selfish and sinful desires. Recent studies have revealed that childhood sexual abuse is as prevalent in Baptist churches as it is in Catholic churches. The number of identified abusers in the Catholic church is almost 3,000. There are other issues such as misuse of church funds. Or, favoritism among members. It should be understood that the message of God's word will convict sinners, but it is for their own good. Godly conviction leads to repentance.

These problems have been with God's people from the start. The Old Testament prophets warned the false prophets and the corrupt priest. And Jesus condemned the Scribes and Pharisees calling them hypocrites, who placed heaven burdens on the people and wouldn't lift a finger to help them.

In the new year I am committed to trust in God, to rely on His sovereign power. To be a faithful servant of God to the church and the community. To live in the truth, and to do so with integrity, so that the gospel is not veiled by my life, and people can see and hear the unhindered good news of Jesus in my words and in my life. My reward will be to hear the Lord say to me one day, "Well done, good and faithful servant." To neither become a casualty, or to leave casualties in my wake. **Terry Fortner**


January is Sanctity of Human Life Month


