From the Pastor's Desk



One of the most common images of God in the Bible is that of a shepherd. For example:

He shall feed his flock like a shepherd...and gently lead those who are young Isaiah 40:11 He goes on ahead of them, and his sheep follow him...John 10:4

In 1836 Dorothy Thrupp lived in London England and inspired by the thought of God being like a shepherd wrote a song. "Savior, like a Shepherd Lead Us" (#61 in our Baptist Hymnal). It is a much beloved hymn and is often used as an invitation. It was originally written for use by children and first was published in Hymns for the Young. It has been included in 1,064 hymnals. Its shepherd image of Jesus is one of the strongest thematic ideas shared in both the Old and New Testaments, as in Psalm 23 and John 12. It certainly continues to be very appropriate in our day and in the life of our church. Shepherds were diligent in their watch care over their lambs. Young lambs knew instantly, if they wandered off, the call of each individual mother. Shepherds also lived hard and heroic lives. The main problem with so much Christian art and popular belief is that it depicts

Jesus wandering through an idyllic landscape, followed by immaculately clean animals, with no suggestion that a predator most likely is lingering close waiting for a fresh meal. David, when he volunteers to take on Goliath, reminds Saul that, as a faithful shepherd, he had placed himself between the flock and a lion and a bear. The man who wrote Psalm 23 knew that leading the sheep to grass and to water often proved hazardous, and that he had taken great risks to ensure the safety of his precious sheep. When Jesus claims to be the good shepherd, we know he didn't run from danger. Jesus went to the cross, giving his all to rescue us.

"Savior, like a shepherd lead us, much we need Thy tender care; In Thy pleasant pastures feed us, for our use Thy folds prepare: Blessed Jesus, blessed Jesus, Thou hast bought us, Thine we are; Blessed Jesus, blessed Jesus, Thou hast bought us, Thine we are."

Let Him be a shepherd to you, whatever age you are. Hear the voice of the shepherd and follow Him.


