From the Pastor's Desk



The story of Jonah and the whale (the Bible says it was a great fish). Has always been one of my favorite Sunday School stories. I was a boy and accepted the story as true. I never questioned if a fish could swallow a man, and that man could remain alive inside the fish for three days. It was only later that the questioning of that story came to my mind. I long ago decided that the best answer is yes that did happen because God prepared the fish, and God can do anything He wants with a fish or a man. I like the answer Philip Brooks, gave when asked about Jonah's fish story, "well Jonah was a minor prophet, so the fish swallowed him without major difficulty."

The fish miracle of Jonah often overshadows the most important part of the story of Jonah. That is the message God gave him for the residents of Nineveh.

"In forty days, the city of Nineveh will be destroyed." Then the people of Nineveh repented and the destiny of the city was changed. The city and its people were spared from God' punishment.

I often struggle with what I should preach on Sunday. That's one reason I pray and plan ahead for several Sundays. I don't want to come up on Sunday morning with nothing to say. I once got some great but brief advice from another preacher. He said "Stand up and tell the people that Jesus can change your life." So that's it, the message of Jonah, the message of the gospel. It's simple. Just trust Jesus, He can change your life. Never miss that simple message because you have questions about something the Bible says, that you do not, and may never understand.

2022 One Day Mission Trip

Saturday, October 1, 2022

One Day Acts 1:8 Missions Experience provides an annual opportunity for Arkansas Baptists to impact lostness in a specific area of our state. Partnering with the churches of a local Associa-

tion, Arkansas Baptists from across the state spend five hours on the first Saturday in October serving in a variety of ministries. Since 2010, more than 22,000 Arkansas Baptists have been mobilized for missions through One Day. That's an average of 2,100 Arkansas Baptists missionaries serving each year! At least 850 salvations have been recorded between 2010-2021. During One Day, Arkansas Baptists have led someone to faith in Jesus every 4 minutes!

COST: \$10 per participant: adults & minors 8 -17 (children 7 & younger may serve w/parent at no cost). Registration fee helps provide materials for ministry sites as well as lunch for all participants. All other One Day expenses are funded by the generous missions giving of ABSC churches through Cooperative Program and Dixie Jackson Arkansas Missions Offering.

NEW this year: One Day T-shirts! The registration has a place for you to order a One Day T-shirt. Shirts are \$10 each and will be available to pick up at the kickoff location. Purchasing a shirt is completely optional and must be paid at the time of registration.
