God's will or my will. Jesus taught his disciples to pray, "Our father, which art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name, Thy Kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in Heaven." I struggle with my life's challenges? I wake up with aches and pain in my back, legs or shoulder. Some days I have a pain in my heart from worries, fears, and disappointments. Apply Now for 2023 Scholarships Do you know any high school seniors?

First Electric Cooperative (FECC) will award \$2,000 scholarships to nine high school seniors living in the co-op's service area in 2023. They are funded through the member-supported Operation Round-Up program. To be eligible for the scholarships, applicants must be a high school senior whose parents or guardians are First Electric members. They must have a minimum 3.0 grade-point average through their senior year of high school and after graduation attend an accredited institute of higher learning in Arkansas on a full-time basis, which includes technical career programs. Deadline to apply is May 1!

Applications may also be picked up from First Electric district offices.
