The theme for this years Annie Armstrong Easter Offering is **Make Jesus Known.** The vision for global missions in Matthew 28:16-20 looks like sharing the gospel in conversation and with our actions. So how do we apply the call for global missions at home? How do seek to make disciples and make God's name known in our hometowns? I wanted to share some ideas I found that may be helpful. Some Ideas to Be on Mission at Home Seek faith-based conversations

- Get to know your neighbors. Invite them out to dinner or plan an outing at a gallery, concert, or park. As you grow in relationship, look for opportunities to incorporate your faith in conversations.
- 2. Grab coffee (or ice cream!) with your classmates outside of the school year. Spend time investing in friendships with non-believers and believers.
- 3. Ask God to open doors where you work. Love the people you work with by showing an interest in them.

Do life together

- 4. Ask a friend to go to church with you and your family.
- 5. Plan a picnic at a nearby park or on campus. Invite all your friends.
- 6. Gather your friends, family, and church to host a fundraiser for a missionary.
- 7. Celebrating a holiday? Ask guests to bring a non-perishable food item to your party instead of gifts, then give the collection to a local food bank or shelter.

- Plan, host, and invite people to celebrate holidays together, such as Easter and Christmas.

- 12. Serve as a camp counselor or volunteer at your church's summer camp.
- 13. Donate food to your church's blessing box.
- 14. Does your church need help with seasonal work? Ask about any gardening, painting, or cleaning that needs to be done and donate a couple of hours towards it.






Share a Memory

- 18. Gather your family, friends, and garbage bags to do a "Community Clean Up."

- 19. Donate clothes to the Salvation Army or a nearby homeless shelter.
- 20. Bake cookies (or bread) for your neighbor.
- 21. Fill an Operation Christmas Child shoebox for Samaritan's Purse! ZHBC has a list of items we're gathering!

Pursue the Kingdom Daily

- 22. Share a verse on social media, and write about how it has impacted your life.
- 23. Pray for a mentor, and once you've got one, pray for someone to mentor.
- 24. Write a letter of encouragement to a missionary.
- 25. Text an encouraging verse to your friends and family!
- 26. Introduce yourself to someone at church, get to know them, and pray with them.
- 27. Find ways to help your family, from helping your siblings finish their homework, to washing the dishes.
- 28. Volunteer at your local library! Offer to read stories, organize the shelves, and assist visitors.
