

LETTER FROM PASTOR MICHAEL

The Value of Sacrificial Generosity

We have a generous church. I heard a story about a man who told his pastor he'd donate \$1,000 if his name was mentioned during the sermon. The next Sunday, the pastor announced, "As Jesus said, blessed are the humble... unlike our brother John who donated \$1,000 to hear his name in church today." So no names, just a big thanks!

Sacrificial generosity goes beyond conventional giving. It's rooted in the early church example where believers shared everything they had (Acts 2:44-45). This expression of faith demonstrates our complete dependence on God, acknowledging that everything we possess is ultimately a gift from Him, that we put His Kingdom first, and that we care for each other.

When we give sacrificially, we experience transformation in several ways:

- ****For the Church:**** Sacrificial giving enables ministry expansion, supports those in need, and creates a culture of authentic community. When resources are shared freely, the church becomes a living testimony of God's provision and care.
- ****For Ourselves:**** Paradoxically, giving sacrificially enriches our own lives. It loosens the grip of materialism, deepens our trust in God's provision, and aligns our hearts with His priorities. We discover the truth that "it is more blessed to give than to receive."

When we embrace sacrificial generosity, we participate in God's redemptive work in the world. We become conduits of His blessing to others, fulfilling the promise that we are "blessed to be a blessing" (Genesis 12:2).

Sacrificial generosity isn't measured by amount but by attitude—giving that costs us something demonstrates faith that God will continue to provide for our needs while using our resources to partner with Him in His work.
